JUST 332: Juvenile Delinquency
JUST 334: The Enforcement System
JUST 335: The Rehabilitative System
JUST 430: Senior Seminar (completion of all other section I courses required)

Section II: (At least 5 courses needed from this section)

JUST 212: Scientific Investigation
JUST 281: Intro to Forensic Science (JUST 212 recommended prior to this course)
JUST 282: Probation, Parole & Community Corrections
JUST 305: Criminal Law (JUST 307 recommended prior to this course)
JUST 308: W/E Organization & Management (writing-enhanced)
JUST 333: Juvenile Law & Procedures
JUST 340: Prisoner Reentry: Policy and Procedure
JUST 400: Constitutional Limits on Law Enforcement (JUST 307 recommended prior to this course)
JUST 401: Contemporary Correctional Treatment Methods (JUST 335 is a prerequisite)
JUST 408: Justice Systems Methodology (junior or senior status)
JUST 409: Comparative Legal Systems (JUST 307 is a prerequisite)
JUST 410: Advanced Topics in Justice Systems (junior or senior status)
JUST 416: Readings in Justice Systems (15 hours JUST courses, junior or senior status, prior approval)

- * **Bolded courses are Section I courses** -all are required for the major (a list of Section 1 courses is listed on the back)
- * **15 credit hours of Section II courses** - required for the major (a list of Section II courses is listed on the back)
- * **Minor or Required Support: 15 hours (may include semester/summer internship 1-8 credit hours)**
- * **Intercultural Perspective** 0*-5 credits (May double-count with other LSP, major, or minor requirements)
All Study Abroad experiences approved for academic credit at Truman fulfill the Intercultural Perspective Requirement
- *Selected courses may also fulfill an LSP: Modes of Inquiry requirement, if cross-listed as an option.
- * **At least 6 Modes of Inquiry** completed
- * **Bachelor of Science Degree Requirements:** Liberal Studies Program: 31-57 credits
Additional required math and science-based courses, minimum 6 credits
- * **2.20 Major GPA and 2.20 Cumulative GPA must be maintained**
- * **A total of 120 hours are required for graduation**
