## **Programs**

- Bachelor of Arts (BA) degrees in Classics, French, German, Romance Languages, Spanish and Russian.
- Approximately 60% of CML majors earn a double major—in a second language, Business, Political Science, Biology, Mathematics, Psychology, Communications, Communication Disorders and many other fields.
- A CML major is a great complement to pre-professional programs, especially in education, medicine, health sciences, and law.
- Pursue a minor in French, French in Translation, German, Greek, Latin, Spanish, Spanish for the Professions (Health and Business), and Russian Studies.
- Interdisciplinary minors are offered in Asian Studies, Classical Studies and Italian Studies.
- Earn an interdisciplinary major in Chinese Studies, Italian Studies or Japanese Studies.
- Master of Arts in Education degrees are offered in French, Romance Languages and Spanish.

## **Faculty**

- · Experienced faculty teach all courses at all levels.
- 36 full-time faculty members, most of whom hold a PhD in their field.
- Native speakers from Argentina, Austria, China, Colombia, Cuba, France, Germany, Japan, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Senegal, and Spain.
- · Leaders in national and regional language organizations.
- · Published authors of books, journal articles, poems, and plays.

### In The Classroom

- Study of a foreign language is a priority on Truman's campus: approximately 1/3 of Truman students are enrolled in a foreign language class at any given time.
- Class size for advanced courses ranges from 5-25 students.

## **After the Degree**

- Live and work abroad as Fulbright or Boren Scholars in Andorra, Argentina, Germany, Mozambique, Russia, Thailand, Venezuela, Bulgaria, Spain, Georgia, and Mexico.
- Attend graduate school in fields such as academic administration, communications, education, law, linguistics, literature, medicine, and translation/interpretation at schools such as Yale University, George Washington University, University of Kentucky, Monterrey Institute of International Studies, University of Wisconsin, University of North Carolina, University of Michigan, Cornell University, Northwestern University, University of Texas-Austin, and University of Illinois-Urbana/Champaign.
- Teach English as a Foreign Language in countries such as China, Italy, Spain, France, Japan, Korea, Russia, Taiwan and Vietnam.
- Teach elementary, middle and high school throughout Missouri and the nation.
- Practice law, earning a J.D. degree from universities such as Georgetown University, Washington University, the University of Colorado-Boulder, the University of Missouri, and the University of Pittsburgh.
- Practice medicine, earning a M.D. or D.O. degree at schools such as St. Louis University, School of Osteopathic Medicine in Arizona, and A.T. Still University.
- Become a university professor at schools like the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill, University of Queensland-Australia, University of Kansas, Michigan State University, Bucknell University, and the University of Houston.
- · Write professionally as a novelist, screen writer, or journalist.
- Work as a professional translator in the United States and Canada or as a print editor abroad.
- Establish your own business, like Arts and Letters boutique (Springfield, Mo.), Renderance Translation Services (St. Louis, Mo.), Institute of Modern Spanish (Mérida, Mexico) and hold a management position in international business and trade.
- · Work for a non-profit at home or abroad.
