CULTURAL INTEGRATION LEADERS

Cultural Integration Leaders (or CILs, for short) serve international students in their halls and off-campus.

Each international student will have an assigned CIL. You will meet this person when you arrive at Truman.

CILs' duties include helping their students arrange transportation for running essential errands, and helping students deal with some American processes such as applying for a social security number or figuring out how to go about paying bills. CILs are on call to help you if you have a problem!

ACADEMIC SUCCESS MENTORS

Academic Success Mentors (or ASMs, for short) are assigned to first year students to meet for thirty minutes a week to help students adapt to an American classroom environment and develop the necessary skills to excel. They are a great resource for learning about study skills, classroom etiquette, and general advice concerning academic matters. If you will be first year student, you will be contacted by your mentor at the beginning of the school year.

EMERGENCIES – WHEN CAN I EXPECT IMMEDIATE HELP FROM THE ISAO?

What is an emergency?

- a family tragedy
- car accident
- getting arrested
- being hospitalized

What is NOT an emergency?

- Do you have my grades?
- Did my work permit come in?
- Will you be in your office tomorrow?
- I forgot to have my I-20 signed and I'm leaving tonight!

Orientation: There are many specific issues that international students face. Orientation is designed to help students understand their responsibilities concerning their immigration status, being good students, and learning about the resources available to them. You **MUST** understand the rules governing your student visa in order to remain a legal student in the United States.

Wednesday, January 7th, 2015

- Arrival – Be in Kirksville by 5pm. Note that you may not be able to arrive in the United States on January 7th and arrive in Kirksville on the same day. Travel within the U.S. can be very slow. We recommend allowing yourself one day to travel just within the United States.
