



Health Science (BS), Individualized concentration

The following plan is possible on the presumption that an incoming student has an Associate of Arts (AA) degree and has completed the equivalent to **BIOL 100, PSYC 160, foreign language, Missouri Statute, and other Perspective requirements** prior to enrolling at Truman State University. This plan is one suggestion for sequencing major courses for students. There are other ways to sequence major courses, therefore students are encouraged to consult with their academic advisor to make strategic academic decisions about which courses to take each semester.

The Writing Enhanced (WE) course requirements are met by completing **HLTH 320** (as an elective in the major or another WE course in any area), **HLTH 349**, and **JINS 3XX**.
