

Modern Language (BA), Spanish Specialization

The following plan is possible on the presumption that an incoming student has an Associate of Arts (AA) degree and has completed the equivalent to Intermediate Spanish II (4th semester of Spanish) prior to enrolling at Truman State University.

FALL - Semester 1

FALL - Semester 3

- SPAN 460: Survey of Spanish Peninsular Literature (3 cr)
- Dialogues Curriculum course

SPRING - Semester 2

- SPAN 353: Intro to Hispanic Literature (3 cr)
- SPAN 364: Spanish Phonetics & Phonology (3 cr)
- SPAN 300-level elective (3 cr) **OR** SPAN 362: Civilization of Spain (3 cr)
- Dialogues Curriculum course

SPRING - Semester 4

- SPAN 400-level elective (3 cr)
- SPAN 461: WE/Survey of Spanish-American Literature (3 cr)
- CML 470: Modern Language Capstone Experience (2 cr)
- Dialogues Curriculum course
- Elective course (if needed)

NOTES:

- Most Spanish majors study abroad. Through participation in a Truman faculty-led summer program, a student can bring back 6 credit hours applicable to the major. This would make semester 3 more feasible, for example.
- WE = Writing Enhanced course
- **The Dialogues curriculum** requires a certain number of courses/credit hours in the following Perspectives: Social, Arts and Humanities, STEM, Communications, and Statistics. The exact number of courses a student will be required to take during their undergraduate career varies individually according to the credit transferred in.
