All 300- and 400-level courses (after GERM 300, the composition and conversation course) count toward the major and need not be taken sequentially; GERM 332 and 333 are offered about every four years, but they are not required.

The exact number of courses a student will be required to take during their undergraduate career varies individually according to the credit transferred in.
