Course Updates

ACCT 220 Introduction to Financial Accounting

An introduction to the concepts and principles underlying accounting information and its use by external decision makers. Students MUST take the ACCT 211 and 212 sequence OR the ACCT 220 and 221 sequence. Prerequisite: BSAD 107 or BSAD 157.

ACCT 221 Introduction to Management Accounting

An introduction to the concepts and principles underlying accounting information and its use by internal decision makers. A brief introduction to international accounting issues is included. Students MUST take the ACCT 211 and 212 sequence OR the ACCT 220 and 221 sequence. Prerequisite: ACCT 220.

ACCT 302 Financial Reporting I

Prerequisites = ACCT 212 or ACCT 221 AND Major in Accounting or Business Administration.

<u>ACCT 303 Financial Reporting II</u> Prerequisites = ACCT 302 AND Major in Accounting.

<u>ACCT 319 Cost Management Accounting</u> Prerequisites = ACCT 212 or ACCT 221 AND Major in Accounting or Business Administration.

<u>ACCT 367 Accounting Information Systems</u> Prerequisites = Completion of or concurrent enrollment in ACCT 302 AND Major in Accounting.

<u>ACCT 368 Accounting Systems Integration/Data Extraction</u> Prerequisites = ACCT 367 AND Major in Accounting.

ACCT 407 Federal Taxation

Prerequisites = Completion of or concurrent enrollment in ACCT 303 AND Major in Accounting or Business Administration.

<u>ACCT 505 Accounting for Non-Business Entities</u> Prerequisites = ACCT 302 or ACCT 503 AND Major in Accounting.

New Course

BSAD 200 Personal Finance

3 hours

This course covers the management of household and personal finances. It provides an overview of financial concepts with special emphasis on their application to issues faced by individuals and households: budget management, taxes, savings, housing and other major acquisitions, borrowing, insurance, investments, meeting retirement goals, and estate planning.
