CULTURAL INTEGRATION LEADERS

Cultural Integration Leaders (or CILs, for short) serve international students in their halls and off-campus.

Each international student will have an assigned CIL. You will meet this person when you arrive at Truman.

CILs' duties include helping their students arrange transportation for running essential errands, and helping students deal with some American processes such as applying for a social security number or figuring out how to go about paying bills.



INTERNATIONAL AMBASSADORS



International Ambassadors (or IAs, for short) serve to help new international students better integrate to US life. Their first hand experience can help new students feel more comfortable. Don't hesitate to contact international ambassadors with questions you might not feel comfortable asking an American.

International Ambassadors also attend campus events to help American students and international students better understand one another.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS MENTORS


Academic Success Mentors (or ASMs, for short) are assigned to first year students to meet for thirty minutes a week to help students adapt to an American classroom environment and develop the necessary skills to excel.

ASMs are a great resource for learning about study skills, classroom etiquette, and general advice concerning academic matters. If you will be first year student, you will be contacted by your mentor at the beginning of the school year.

Orientation: There are many specific issues that international students face. Orientation is designed to help students understand their responsibilities concerning their immigration status, being good students, and learning about the resources available to them. You **MUST** understand the rules governing your student visa in order to remain a legal student in the United States.
