Veterans Benefit Policy

Truman State University agrees to follow the guidelines set forth by the Veterans Benefits and Transition Act of 2018 (Public Law 115-407). As stated in the Public Law, “educational institutions must allow GI Bill[®] and VR&E beneficiaries (Chapter 33 and Chapter 31 beneficiaries) to attend a course of education or training for up to 90 days from the date the beneficiary provides a certificate of eligibility, or valid VAF 28-1905.” Truman State University will also, “not impose a penalty, or require the beneficiary to borrow additional funds to cover tuition and fees due to late payments from VA.” (Section 103) – “requires a State Approving Agency (SAA), or the Department of Veteran and Affairs (VA) to disapprove certain courses of education. VA can grant a waiver to these requirements.”
