

Guidance for Determination of On-Campus Reduction, Partial On-Campus Closure or Full Campus Closure*

Key Decision Points

- A combination of community and campus factors could lead to additional campus restrictions. Truman will work in conjunction with the Adair County Health Department (see <https://adair.lphamo.org/2019-novel-coronavirus-update/> for daily updates on Adair County COVID-19 cases) and local healthcare providers.
 - Community Factors
 - Significant government action by the governor or other public official
 - Degradation of community testing and contact tracing capacity for symptomatic individuals
 - Significant and sustained demands that overwhelm local healthcare facilities and providers
 - Campus Factors
 - Degradation of campus testing and contact tracing capacity for symptomatic individuals
 - Campus clusters overwhelm ability to test, trace, quarantine and/or isolate
 - Significant employee absenteeism in critical areas (such as environmental services to maintain a safe, clean campus)

Possible Actions

- Heightened social distancing, increased limitations on group size
- Short-term building/facility closure to deep clean/disinfect
 - Targeted, short-term pivot to remote learning
- Reduce faculty, staff and/or student on-campus density
- On-campus closure, full transition to remote learning
 - Closure of residence halls or shelter-in-place
 - Considerations
 - Travel restrictions
 - Viable, alternative living arrangements for students
