Question & Response

- 1. Clarification How thick is the wood floor system and does it have a sleeper? Is it adhered directly to the substrate? Questions 1 and 2 should have been answered as below on Addendum 2.
 - a. Existing wood floor is Action Floor Systems, LLC, Channel Flex Ultra NR 25/32" x 2-1/4" width, 2nd and better maple floor, or University approved equivalent. Following is from the 2013 specs. The sports floor system must provide the stability of an anchored floor with the uniform resiliency of a floating system, consisting in general of a vapor barrier, resilient pads, continuous steel channel, steel anchors, wood sub-flooring, maple flooring, sanding, sealers, finishes, game lines and wall base. Flooring system shall have been independently tested and certified to meet or exceed USSL and ISSS standards. The current flooring is directly adhered to the substrate.
- 2. Be advised that all access to the small gym in the Pershing Building has stairs.
- 3. What height of wall base is preferred?
 - a. Truman State University prefers a 6" tall wall base.
- 4. Is demolition mandatory?
 - a. Per Part II, B. Required Specifications, 2. Demolition in the Request for Proposal
 - 2. Demolition:
 - a. Demolish and remove existing gymnasium floor and subfloor only to the extent required for new construction.
 - b. Comply with hauling and disposal regulations of authorities having jurisdiction.
 - c. Maintain existing utilities and protect them against damage during demolition.
 - d. Schedule demolition so as not to interfere with Truman's operations.
 - e. Provide temporary barriers to protect against injury and damage to the construction area.
